

Conditions

A CCTV system shall be installed and maintained on the licensed premises. Recordings shall be accurately timed and dated and shall be retained for a minimum period of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer of the Police or Licensing Authority upon request, and a member of staff competent at downloading/accessing images shall be on duty at the premises whilst it is open to the public. Notices specifying CCTV surveillance is operating shall be displayed prominently at the premises. It should be noted that any retention, use or disclosure of personal information caught on CCTV must be carried out in line with the data protection principles which shall override any conflicting element of this condition.

The premises licence holder shall adopt a 'Challenge 25' proof of age scheme. The premises licence holder shall operate a requirement for the production of a passport, driving licence or other bona fide form of identity carrying a photographic image, where the individual requesting the supply of alcohol appears to be under the age of 25.

Patrons shall not be permitted to leave the premises with opened bottles or glassware.

No illegal drugs shall be permitted on the premises, and all hirers/users made aware of a zero tolerance to drugs on the premises. Notices shall be prominently displayed and maintained in respect of this matter.

Notices shall be prominently displayed and maintained on the premises requesting that attendees/users of the licensed premises leave the premises and the vicinity quietly and with respect to the needs of neighbouring properties.

Notices shall be prominently displayed and maintained on the premises detailing fire and emergency evacuation procedures.

Children shall only be permitted on the licensed premises during licensed activities or events where accompanied and/or under the supervision of an adult.

Prior to any outdoor event (including events taking place in a marquee) that includes the performance of amplified live or recorded, music, or where the nature of the event has the potential to result in disturbance, the licence holder shall submit a Noise Management Plan (NMP) in writing to the Licensing Authority for approval. The first draft of the NMP shall be submitted not less than 21 days prior to the first day of the event taking place. Amplified live and recorded music will only take place following approval of the NMP by the relevant responsible authority. This document shall thereafter be retained and adhered to, and reviewed on an annual basis to take account of any changes in the premises.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that staff undertake a litter pick around the premises daily.

During operating hours, the premises licence holder or a nominated representative shall be available to receive and respond to nuisance-related complaints. A contact telephone number shall be provided to the Licensing Authority for that purpose.

The premises licence holder shall ensure that all members of staff shall undertake suitable and sufficient training in respect of licensing law, offences in relation to prohibited sales and good practice in relation to promotion of the licensing objectives. Training records shall be accurately and legibly maintained and produced upon demand to an authorised officer of the Police or Licensing Authority.

The premises licence holder shall ensure that a robust hiring process and agreement is in place for third party hiring requests to hire the licensed premises for licensable activities, so as to ensure that the licensing objectives are promoted.
