CIL RECEIPT ALLOCATIONS

The CIL receipts are allocated as follows.

• Admin CIL – Up to 5% of the CIL receipts are retained by the District Council towards administration of the CIL service. If the 5% collected exceeds the expenditure for running the CIL service, the remaining funds are saved in the Strategic Infrastructure Fund (see below).

- **Neighbourhood CIL** 15% or 25% (depending on whether the parish have a made Neighbourhood Plan) will be passed to the parish or town council where the development is taking place. The parish or town council will decide how to spend this part of the levy. Annual Financial Reports on CIL for each parish or town council receiving CIL are published on the town or parish councils' own websites.
- **REG 59F Parish Meetings** These funds are Neighbourhood CIL payments which are held by the District Council on behalf of a parish where the parish do not operate a banking account. These funds are then spent by the District Council on behalf of the parish on infrastructure projects the parish request.
- Strategic Infrastructure Fund 20% of all CIL collected (after the 5% Admin charge and the Parish apportionment has been deducted) is saved in a separate funding pot for Strategic Infrastructure expenditure. The projects which can be funded with the Strategic Fund are defined in the approved CIL expenditure framework.
- Ringfenced Infrastructure Fund Infrastructure for new major housing growth (which is classed as developments over ten dwellings) is prioritised in the CIL Expenditure Framework and the CIL monies collected against such schemes are saved in a separate fund in order that these monies are available for infrastructure for areas that these housing projects affect. This portion of the CIL receipts amount to the remaining 80% of the collected funds (after the 5% Admin charge, Parish apportionment and the 20% for Strategic Infrastructure Fund has been deducted)
- Local Infrastructure Fund The 80% of collected funds (after the 5% Admin charge, Parish apportionment and the 20% for Strategic Infrastructure Fund has been deducted) are allocated to the Local Infrastructure Fund (apart from the 80% for the Ringfenced applications) This Local Infrastructure Fund (definition in the CIL Expenditure Framework) holds the "available funds" (together with the Strategic and Ringfenced Infrastructure funds) that CIL Bids will be spent against. CIL bids can be received throughout the year following a bid enquiry form being submitted. Upon receipt of the bid enquiry form the Infrastructure Team will work with the applicant until such time as the project is ready to be officially submitted as a CIL bid application for determination.

CIL ADMIN

The 5% amount of CIL collected within the reporting year is £354,012.67. This is 5% of the total CIL receipts collected of £7,080,253.51.

Mid Suffolk District Council has set a collection percentage of 5.00%. The percentage taken may differ due to Land payments (including payments in kind and infrastructure payments) not being allocated to administration expenses and Surcharges not being split with Neighbourhood Areas.

The amount of CIL spent on administration expenses during the reported year is £289,185.88. A deduction of £3,440.74 was also taken due to the issue of a refund of CIL collected. The remaining £61,386.05 in excess of administration expenses and refunds has been saved in the Strategic Infrastructure Fund for spend on Infrastructure projects.

REGULATION 59

The charging authority is compelled under the CIL legislation to spend their CIL payments to fund infrastructure to support the development of its area. The charging authority is also able to apply CIL to fund infrastructure outside its area where to do so would support the development of its area.

REGULATION 59B

Regulation 59B relates strongly to 59A, to detail and advise concerning land payments accepted by a charging authority. The CIL that is received in relation to a development that includes the CIL payments and where any land payments were accepted by the charging authority. The payments to a local council relating to a land payment to assist with paying a CIL amount must be paid to the local council in money.

REGULATION 59E

5-year Clawback - This CIL regulation applies to Neighbourhood Parish CIL payments and the clawback of funding if this money is not used. CIL funding that has been paid to Parishes or Town Councils via the Neighbourhood Parish CIL payments, that have not been applied to support the development of its area within 5 years of receiving this funding can be reclaimed by the District Council. This repayable amount would be requested via a notice to the local Parish or Town Council requiring it to repay some or all the CIL receipts that they have received.

This notice would advise the amount of CIL funding which must be repaid and the reasons for this funding being reclaimed by the District Council. The date in which the funding must be reclaimed must also be advised on the notice.

On receipt of this notice the Parish or Town Council that has received the notice must return to the District Council any CIL receipts that have not been spent up to the 5-year clawback period. If they are unable to return this funding, then future CIL receipts will be used to make up the balance.

Once this funding is returned the District Council are then bound by the CIL legislation to spend this funding in the local area in which it was collected.

CASE STUDIES OF THREE COMPLETED CIL BID PROJECTS

Mid Suffolk District Council

Pioneering Paths Project, Thornham Walks

Thornham Walks was created forty years ago as a network of pathways on the Thornham Estate, whose premise was making countryside and nature accessible to all. In total, Thornham Walks provides visitors with 12 miles of walking routes around the estate and the surrounding area.

Through the Pioneering Paths project, the Friends of Thornham Walks wanted to modernise a 1.5 kilometre long tarmacked pathway, with a new 'Flexipave' surface. This particular footpath is extremely well used by visitors to Thornham Walks as it links the car parks to the children's Playground, the Walled Garden, the Enchanted Wood and other attractions and facilities located throughout the site.

At the time of making the District CIL Bid application, this existing tarmacked footpath had been in place for over 25 years and despite the Friends of Thornham Walks undertaking regular repairs and maintenance on the route, large sections of the footpath surface had developed potholes and/or cracks and fissures going through to the footpath's foundation. These issues with the footpath made it difficult for visitors with mobility issues, wheelchair users and families with prams/pushchairs to move around the estate.

With visitors' numbers increasing on an annual basis together with the establishment of a weekly 'Parkrun' on the site on Saturday mornings, the rate and level of damage to the footpath had been increasing, also repairs to the footpath becoming both more expensive and time consuming for volunteers and altogether less effective. To address these issues the 'Friends of Thornham Walks' developed the Pioneering Paths project.

The 'Friends of Thornham Walks' named the project Pioneering Paths:

"because it is a pioneering, new environmentally friendly pavement; but also because it is trailblazing, progressive and groundbreaking in our county."

Friends of Thornham Walks (October 2023)

The aim of the project was to remove the existing tarmacked footpath with a new 'Flexipave', (a mix of recycled ground rubber and stone aggregate, bonded with a polyurethane surface. This new surface would be long-lasting and enhance the visitor experience by making the route easier to use by people with mobility issues and/or disabilities.

Through this project 'The Friends of Thornham Walks' hoped to achieve a number of outcomes, which included, but not limited to the following:

- 'Flexipave' would provide a lower impact surface for walking, running and wheeled use, providing a more comfortable surface, encouraging people to walk longer and further.
- The new surface would be more slip resistant and help to minimise the risk of accidents and also hopefully give people with mobility issues and disabilities more confidence in walking the route.
- The path would be designed to include colours that were identified as being dementia-friendly and therefore would improve the walking conditions for people with dementia.
- The surface is porous, allowing rainwater to drain away, rather than pool on the surface and therefore reduce creating potential trip and slip hazards.
- The new footpath would be flexible, which would be better at accommodating root growth from the surrounding trees.

The Friends of Thornham Walks submitted a District CIL funding application for £100,000.00, which was agreed by Mid Suffolk District Council Members in July 2024. The funding package for the project was completed by the group securing a £20,000.00 Community Development Grant from Mid Suffolk District Council, a £1,000.00 grant from Tesco's Bags of Help Fund together with the Friends of Thornham Walks contributing £20,146.70 of their own funding. The total cost of the project was £141,146.70.

Work on the project began in October 2024, with the footpath being completed and officially opened in January 2025.

Land Drainage and Car Park, Oaks Meadow Project CIO

The Oaks Meadow Project CIO was established in 2020, after it had received the gift of a four-acre plot of land, in Little Finborough. Through working with the local community, the project has created a communal area that provides facilities for recreation, socialisation and education.

Over the last five years, the project's trustees and volunteers have developed the site to create a wildlife pond, a variety of garden spaces, a wooden gazebo seating area, children's play area and outdoor fitness area. The Charity has also planted 500 trees and 450 metres of hedgerow and in 2022 Oaks Meadow was designated as a Healing Wood by Suffolk County Council.

The number of people using the site has been increasing year on year, but, given the rurality of the site, most visitors travel by car or cycle to access the site. Although there was no designated car park area, visitors were able to park on site. However, due to drainage and flooding issues, the site became inaccessible to cars after periods of heavy rain, which led to visitors parking on nearby roads, creating traffic problems

and raising concerns in the surrounding area. To help alleviate these problems, the project trustees developed the Land Drainage and Car Park project.

The aim of the project was to improve the drainage in the area of the site where a dedicated 20-space car parking area could be built. The car park would also provide cycle stands, be surrounded by a perimeter fence to restrict vehicle access to the rest of the site and lockable gates.

The total cost of the project was £35,488.33, with funding for the project coming from a £4,500.00 contribution from Combs Parish Council and the Charity putting in £4,500.00 of its own funding. To complete the funding package for the project Oaks Meadow CIO submitted a District CIL funding application for £26,488.33. This application was approved by Mid Suffolk District Council Members in September 2024.

Work on the project began in January 2025 and was completed in February 2025

Community Centre Development, Norton Village Hall

Over the last 10 years, the Management Committee of Norton Village Hall has undertaken a series of improvement projects to the hall that was originally built in the 1970's. During this time, the Management Committee has completed work on fully insulating the suspended ceiling in the main hall, installed a modern commercial kitchen and toilet facilities, installed a new air source heating/cooling system, light and sound system (for the stage), wi-fi and CCTV systems and created new storage facilities.

However, despite these upgrades the physical limitations of the building, which provided a main hall with stage area and a small adjoining committee room, meant that the building could not provide space for more bookings and a wider range of activities and therefore could not generate more income.

To develop the village hall into a multi-functional, modern community centre. the Management Committee developed plans to build an extension onto the village hall, which when completed, would provide additional function rooms for hiring out to users, new storage spaces, a second toilet block facility with showers, to service stage and field sports activities. Also incorporated into the design of the project was the installation of a PV Solar panel array, improved thermal profile of the building and the installation of a rainwater capture system, to help reduce the hall's carbon footprint and running costs.

Mid Suffolk District Council granted planning permission for the extension project in February 2021, with the Management Committee submitting a District CIL Bid application in May 2022. The total cost of the project was £395,765.90 and was jointly funded by a Public Works Loan Board loan of £295,765.90 with £100,000.00 from Mid Suffolks District CIL fund.

Suffolk Coast Recreational Disturbance Avoidance and Mitigation Strategy ('RAMS') Financial Year Report 2024/25

Context

The following information is provided to inform the Suffolk Coast RAMS Executive Group with key financial information on the Suffolk Coast RAMS project from the previous financial year (2024/25). This information is also available to inform each authorities Infrastructure Funding Statement. The financial year 2024/25 is significant as it represents the operational set up period for the Suffolk Coast RAMS (known as Wildlife Wise), with a part year delivery plan agreed by the Executive group from September 2024. Table 1 provides the expenditure annually on the RAMS project since commencement in 2019/20.

2024/25 Expenditure summary

Suffolk Coast RAMS expenditure in 2024-25 has largely arisen in the last two quarters. The Delivery Manager has focussed on the planning, set up and foundations for the Delivery Programme and Ranger recruitment. Therefore, salaries form the largest expenditure within the overall total £129,174.

The website and communication platforms were also set up this financial year. The team is developing its social media reach, providing regular news updates on Wildlife Wise developments and directing traffic to the website for key messages and information. The recruitment of Rangers will develop content and engagement with target audiences.

Planned expenditure committed for 2024/25 included funding for mitigation projects at Kessingland Beach (£4,894) and Orwell Country Park (£7,480) and the Strategy Review report commissioned from Footprint (£25,220). However, these projects although underway await final invoices for payment. These projects will be reallocated funding to the 2025/26 delivery plan budget.

Development and design of new signage and interpretation boards have been produced in partnership and at no direct financial cost to RAMS to date. Following a detailed audit of the Suffolk Coast sites, plans are in place for updated and new signage for priority areas, to be implemented from 2025/26.
