Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

The management of the premises at 10 Lady Street, Lavenham is committed to upholding all four licensing objectives: the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm. All staff will receive training on licensing law, responsible alcohol service, and the enforcement of the Challenge 25 policy to ensure only eligible individuals are served alcohol. Clear policies and procedures will support the safe and responsible operation of the premises, promoting a secure and welcoming environment for both customers and the wider community.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

To deterand detect anyincidents of crime or anti-social behaviour, a comprehensive CCTV system will be installed covering internal and external areas, including entry points and outdoor spaces. Footage will be retained for a minimum of 28 days and provided to the police upon request. All staff will be trained in conflict resolution and responsible alcohol service, including refusing service to intoxicated or disorderly individuals. An incident log will be maintained on-site to record any relevant occurrences, including refusals of alcohol sales and any disorderly conduct.

c) Public safety

The premises will comply with all relevant health and safety and fire regulations, including the provision of clearly marked fire exits, emergency lighting, and up-to-date fire-fighting equipment. The layout of the bar, lounge, snug, and courtyard areas is designed to allow for safe customer movement and effective supervision by staff. First aid supplies will be kept on-site, and a trained first aider will be present during opening hours. Maximum occupancy levels will be observed to prevent overcrowding and ensure safe use of the premises.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Tominimisedisturbance to local residents, the courtyard and driveway areas will not be used for alcohol consumption beyond 11:00 PM. Staff will monitor these areas to ensure they are used respectfully and appropriately. No amplified or live music will be played outdoors, and indoor music will be kept at a background level. Clear signage will be displayed asking customers to leave the premises quietly and respectfully. Waste will be managed responsibly, with regular clearing of litter from around the premises, and deliveries and collections will take place at appropriate times.

e) The protection of children from harm

Astrict Challenge 25 policy will be enforced to prevent underage sales of alcohol. Anyone who appears under 25 will be required to present valid photographic ID (passport, photo driving licence, or a PASS-approved proof-of-age card) before being served alcohol. Staff will be trained in age verification procedures and how to refuse service if necessary. Children under 16 will only be permitted on the premises if accompanied by a responsible adult and will not be allowed to remain on site after 9:00 PM. Alcohol will not be promoted in a way that may appeal to minors, and the premises will not host any events targeted at children that involve alcohol. The latest time alcohol will be served is 11:00 PM.
