The application was made under Regulation 5 and comments were invited between Monday 4th April 2016 and Tuesday 3rd May 2016.

Five responses were received but no material representations were made.

Accordingly, under Regulation 7, and following the completion of the statutory consultation, the District Council hereby designates the application area as a Neighbourhood Area in order to facilitate the preparation of a Neighbourhood Plan by Woolpit Parish Council.

Woolpit Neighbourhood Plan Area Designation Application Responses

In order to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan, the first formal stage is to designate the Neighbourhood Area (see Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (as amended)). The 'qualifying body' (the Parish or Town Council) has to apply to Mid Suffolk District Council to designate a neighbourhood area, stating its reasons and submit a map of the proposed area.

Mid Suffolk District Council received an application from Woolpit Parish Council to designate a Neighbourhood Area to enable the production of a Neighbourhood Plan. A statutory consultation as set out in the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (as amended) was undertaken by Mid Suffolk District Council between Monday 4th April 2016 and Tuesday 3rd May 2016.

Using the existing boundary is logical and readily understandable to villagers.
 It conforms to the electoral base that will be consulted later for the NP referendum.

3. By using the parish boundary, the hamlets of Woolpit Heath, Woolpit Green and Borley Green, which are

separate from the main village, are encompassed within the plan area.

- 4. The Parish Council has no reason to believe that any landowner within the parish would wish their land to be excluded.
- 5. Both historically and practically, no reason has been found to suggest an alternative boundary would be more suitable.

Purpose of the Plan

The Plan will ultimately be used for decision-making purposes by Mid Suffolk District Council and Woolpit Parish Council. It will describe how the people of Woolpit want to see their village develop over the next 15 years. It will combine a need for expanding the residential housing stock with appropriate business development, whilst also supporting infrastructure, amenities, and taking into account environmental considerations. The Parish Council sees the Plan as an important opportunity for empowering the village to create an attainable, sustainable vision for its future, voiced by the people themselves.

Steering Group

The Parish Council has delegated the development of the Neighbourhood Development Plan to a voluntary Steering Group (SG) comprising Parish Councillors and other residents. There is also a large number of villagers offering help in various ways. The SG is geographically drawn from all parts of the village and represents a demographically diverse team of residents who jointly have extensive professional expertise and local knowledge.

Community Engagement

Some community outreach and engagement activities have already been undertaken. Two public meetings to discuss the setting up of a NP and what it involves and can produce have taken place. These were attended by 150 residents. From these meetings some 60 people have offered themselves to act either as members of the SG or as helpers. A Neighbourhood Plan webpage has been created.

What the Plan will include

The Plan will set out the views, needs and planning aspirations of as many Woolpit residents as possible concerning a wide range of aspects of village life and the village environment. It will evolve over time but its principal aims will be to identify:

- The anticipated quantity and range of accommodation needed for a sustainable mixed community of homes and businesses.
- Proposals to protect the character of the village and select locations considered as suitable for development.
- Improvements in services and amenities needed to support the community in the future e.g. transport, education, employment, shopping, communications, health, leisure and wellbeing.

Woolpit Parish Council recognises that the Plan will only be valid and successful if it is created by the people who live and work in the village and so reflects their majority view. Hence the intention of the SG is to encourage the whole community to take part in a variety of activities to achieve this objective.
